





# The Impact of the English Bible



## The Impact of the King James Bible



#### LECTURE III.

The return of the Jews to their own land is certain: it is highly probable that the Turkish empire shall be weakened, but not destroyed, in order for this long expected event to take place.—The manner in which they shall seeds the country at sirst.—They shall dwell very securely.—After a time, their enemies shall combine against them; many nations shall join one leader, supposed to be the Grand Turk, or chief prince of the Mahometans.—This army shall pass through the land of Israel like a surious storm; shall prevail; and even take the city Jerusalem, and shall reduce the inhabitants to a state of the greatest distress: but at the last, deliverance shall come suddenly and unexpectedly.—Why God shall suffer this dreadful scene to take place, after the return of the Jews to their own land.

NOTHING need to be more plainly declared than this: viz. That the Jews shall certainly return to and possess their own land again; notwithstanding their long captivity, and utter dispersion. Moses, that great prophet, spake of both these events in sundry places; and expressly declared that they should take place in the latter days: See Lev. xxvi. Deut. iv. 25—31. Deut. xxviii. xxix. xxx.

It is certain that the Lord hath fulfilled his threatenings, in a most awful and exemplary manner; and there can therefore be no reason to doubt but he will fulfil his promises as siterally, exactly, and fully in their due time. 



### Balfour Declaration



Dear Lord Rothschild,

I have much pleasure in conveying to you, on behalf of his Majesty's Government, the following declaration of sympathy with Jewish Zionist aspirations which has been submitted to, and approved by, the Cabinet.

"His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavours to facilitate the achievement of this object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine, or the rights and political status enjoyed by Jews in any

## Timing of the Discovery

#### Yigael Yadin

"I cannot avoid the feeling that there is something symbolic in the discovery of the scrolls and their acquisition at the moment of the creation of the State of Israel. It is as if these manuscripts had been waiting in caves for two thousand years, ever since the destruction of Israel's independence, until the people of Israel had returned to their home and their freedom. This symbolism is heightened by the fact that the first three scrolls were bought by my father for Israel on 29th November, 1947, the very day on which the United Nations voted for the re-creation of the Jewish state in Israel after two thousand years."

WASHINGTON – In a blunt display of differences, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu rejected the idea of using his country's 1967

Canada takes pro-Israel line at G8 summit

Canadian delegation blocks mention of 1967 lines in Group of Eight leaders' joint statement calling Israel, Palestinians to return to peace talks

Group of Eight leaders had to soften a statement urging Israel and the Palestinians to return to negotiations because Canada objected to a specific mention of 1967 borders, diplomats said on Friday.

Canada's right-leaning Conservative government has adopted a staunchly pro-Israel position in international negotiations since coming to power in 2006, with Prime Minister Stephen Harper saying Canada will back Israel whatever the cost.

Diplomats involved in Middle East discussions at the G8 summit said Ottawa had insisted that no mention of Israel's pre-1967 borders be made in the leaders' final communiqué, even though most of the other leaders wanted a mention.

G-8 earmarks billions for Arab countries that have overthrown autocrats, such as Egypt, Tunisia, in order to help establish democracies. IMF also prepared to loan billions, though plans for spending money remain unclear

"The Canadians were really very adamant, even though Obama expressly referred to 1967 borders in his speech last week," one European diplomat said.

A spokesman for Harper would not comment on the line Canada had taken, saying only that the final communiqué would make positions clear.
